- WHAT:** 1) Hosting an Arrêt/Stop Racism Youth Leadership Workshop.
- 2) Launching the “Show Racism the Door” campaign for March 21: International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination.

- WHO:** Over 100 high school students and educators from various schools and organizations will participate.
- WHY:** 1) Students will engage with peers from Regina and surrounding area as they participate in activities to explore identity, intercultural relationships, power, privilege, racism and discrimination. Participants will also learn about the Truth and Reconciliation Recommendations and how to take action. They will learn to facilitate these activities for use in their local schools and communities.
